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

A George III silver swing handle basket by Peter, Ann & William Bateman, the oval form with a scalloped and gadroon rim enclosing engraved foliate borders and a double crest engraving to the centre, depicting a lion rampant with fish scaled lower body alongside a dolphin, the whole with swing handle and raised on an oval collet foot with conforming gadroon edge to both. Hallmarked London, date letter worn probably 1804. Maximum length 14 1/2 inches (37 cm), weight 26.74 ozt (831.7 grams). £400-600 (*plus 27.6% BP\**)



A pair of Edwardian silver mounted Corinthian capital candlesticks, each with filled and stepped square base having beaded border detail and rising to the fluted column, Corinthian capital and removal nozzle with conforming bead rim. Hallmarked Walter Latham & Son, Sheffield 1905. Height 9 3/8 inches (24 cm). £150-250 (plus 27.6% BP\*)



Two George III small silver mugs, each of baluster form to a footed base with a leaf capped double scroll handle, the first also monogram engraved and hallmarked London 1765, maker's mark R.S, possibly for Robert Sallam, the second hallmarked London 1779, indistinct maker's mark. Together with an early Victorian embossed silver open salt, missing liner, hallmarked Richard Sibley II, London 1848. Weight 15.86 ozt (493.2 grams). £150-200 (*plus 27.6% BP\**)



An early twentieth century silver dish, the circular bowl with stylised foliate and diamond pierced sides leading to a trailing floral rim, and raised upon a tripod base with claw feet. Hallmarked Birmingham 1915, maker's mark rubbed, probably E S Barnsley & Co. Diameter 4 3/4 inches (12cm), weight 3.78 ozt (117.8 grams). £40-60 (plus 27.6% BP\*)



An early George V Britannia silver tankard, the plain slightly tapering form with stepped flat-top hinged lid to a scrolled thumb-piece and serpentine handle. Hallmarked C S Harris & Sons Ltd., London 1914. Height including thumb-piece 6 3/8 inches (16.2 cm), weight 26.9 ozt (839 grams). £400-600 (*plus 27.6% BP\**)

A George II plain silver pint mug, of baluster form to a flared footed base, with acanthus capped double scroll handle. Hallmarked William Grundy, London 1758. Height 5 inches (12.7 cm), weight 12.47 ozt (388 grams). **£250-350** (*plus 27.6% BP\**)

An early nineteenth century apple corer, of typical form with stained and turned ivory handle. Struck only with maker's mark 'WB', probably William Bateman II, circa 1826-1839. Length 6 1/4 inches (16 cm). £150-200 (plus 27.6% BP\*)



A Victorian silver mounted glass pedestal bowl, of compressed globular form with silver twin scroll handles and silver rim with engraved armorial, and raised upon a silver spread circular foot. Hallmarked Sheffield 1874, maker's mark C.F, height 4 3/4 inches (12cm). **£60-90** (*plus 27.6% BP\**)

An Edwardian silver planter of circular form, the shaped rim with applied scroll border above a moulded girdle to a plain body and footed base. Hallmarked Mappin & Webb Ltd., London 1907. Height measuring 5 1/8 inches (13 cm), diameter 6 1/4 inches (16 cm), weight 13.16 ozt (409.4 grams). **£100-150** (*plus 27.6% BP\**)

An early eighteenth century silver trefid spoon, the terminal monogram engraved with further initials verso, the bowl with applied rat-tail to heel. A clear glass vanity jar of long cylindrical form with diamond cut band and a smaller, shorter example, each with engine-turned and floral decorated silver lid hallmarked Archibald Douglas, London 1830, length of first jar measuring 7 1/4 inches (18.5 cm). Together with a pair of George III silver open salts, of similar form and embossed with flowers, hallmarked Joseph Craddock & William Ker Reid, London 1817, plus a pair of George III silver salt spoons, hallmarked Thomas Wallis (II) & Jonathan Hayne, London 1816. A George IV silver fish slice, with foliate pierced blade, engraved 'mermaid' crest to terminal and initialled verso, hallmarked James Payne, London 1828, length measuring 11 1/4 inches (28.5 cm). Together with a George III silver Old English pattern basting spoon, hallmarked London 1798, maker's mark worn, probably Peter & Ann Bateman, two Georgian silver teaspoons with later berry decoration and a Victorian sauce ladle and mother-of-pearl handled butter knife. Weight excluding knife 11.63 ozt (361.6 grams). (6). £100-150 (*plus 27.6% BP\**)



A 1930's cased set of six silver and enamel coffee spoons, each stem and bowl reverse decorated with guilloché enamel in shades of blue, green, yellow and mauve. Hallmarked Adie Brothers Ltd., Birmingham 1935. Gross weight 2.28 ozt (71 grams). **£50-80** (*plus 27.6% BP\**)

An early twentieth century small silver import pot and cover, the circular tapering form with beaded rim detail and raised on three legs with scaled claw feet and female bust surmounts, the removable lid with wheat sheaf crest engraving and acorn finial. Hallmarked Berthold Muller, Chester import 1907, also struck with Hanau pseudo-marks for Neresheimer. Height including finial 5 1/2 inches (14 cm), weight 8.3 ozt (258 grams). £100-150 (plus 27.6% BP<sup>+</sup>)



A 1930's silver goblet, the campana shape bowl decorated with lilly pads and bull rushes in relief, engraved 'Henley Royal Regata 1947' to one side and 'The Silver Goblets' to the other, raised on a leaf knopped stem to a florally embossed scallop edge foot. Hallmarked Goldsmiths & Silversmiths Co Ltd., London 1933. Height 7 3/4 (19.7 cm), weight 13 ozt (404.7 grams). £120-180 (p/us 27.6% BP\*)



A George I Britannia silver tankard, of slightly tapering cylindrical form with armorial engraving to front, above a moulded girdle to a skirted base, the domed and hinged lid with scrolled thumb-piece to a scroll handle with scratch engraved initials 'H' over 'I M'. Hallmarked London 1717, maker's mark probably for Seth Lofthouse. Maximum height to thumb-piece measuring 6 7/8 inches (17.5 cm), weight 20.49 ozt (637.2 grams).

The arms are for Ralph HUTCHINSON (born 1740) the son and heir of Ralph RICHARDSON (1700-70) of Richmond who in 1736 married Martha ELLA (1718-85) the daughter and heiress of William ELLA (1686-1731) of Thirsk by Martha NAYLOR (1699-1721) who in turn was the daughter and heiress of Thomas NAYLOR mercer of York and Elizabeth nee NORFOLK. Ralph RICHARDSON (born 1740) married, in 1762 at York, Elizabeth HUTCHINSON of the same descent. The couple had no issue. The HUTCHINSON family were found earlier at Bishopwearmouth County Durham and before that at their place of origin in Cumberland.

The armorial is slightly later engraved, as the earliest it could have been created would be 1762, when the marriage of Ralph HUTCHINSON and Elizabeth HUTCHINSON took place at York, therefore a few years after the assay date of 1717. £1,500-2,000 (plus 27.6% BP\*)





An early George III plain silver tankard, of baluster form with lower girdle detail above a footed base, the domed and hinged lid with scrolled openwork thumb-piece to a double scroll handle. Hallmarked William & James Priest, London 1765. Maximum height to thumb-piece measuring 8 inches (20.5 cm), weight 30.69 ozt (954.6 grams). £1,000-1,500 (plus 27.6% BP\*)



A Victorian silver mounted glass claret jug, the clear glass body of ovoid form to a circular foot, having silver mounted scrolling handle, and hinged cover with beaded borders, engraved crest depicting a raised arm with clenched fist. Hallmarked W & G Sissons, Sheffield 1879. Height 11 1/4 inches (28.5 cm). **£250-350** (*plus* 27.6% *BP\**)

An Austro-Hungarian silver kiddush cup, of typical goblet form and decorated with wavy line engraved panels enclosing a circular vacant cartouche to the front. A George III Irish silver cream jug, of bulbous form with curved handle, the body with alternate banded and plain fluting beneath a lobed border and engraved armorial motif. Hallmarked Thomas Jones (probably), Dublin, missing date letter, circa 1780 - 1791. Height 3 3/4 inches (9.5 cm), weight 3.93 ozt (122.4 grams). £120-180 (*plus 27.6% BP\**)

A cased pair of Victorian silver fish servers, each pierced and engraved with a heron catching fish amidst stylised waves and foliate motifs. Hallmarked Sheffield 1860, ferrules with maker's mark for Henry Wilkinson & Co., handles appear unmarked. Length of slice measuring 13 inches (33 cm). **£80-120** (*plus 27.6% BP\**)
