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A pair of George III silver open salts, each of oval openwork form with ribbed rim above diamond pierced sides and raised on four claw and ball feet, with blue glass liners, hallmarked London 1770, one with maker's mark I.W; together with a pair of shovel condiment spoons, marks distorted. Length of salts 3" (7.7cm), weight excluding glass 2.87 ozt (89.5 grams). £80-120 (plus 27.6% BP)



A George III silver bachelor teapot, of bulbous form with later stained wooden handle and finial, raised upon a short circular foot, the whole with embossed floral and foliate decoration. Hallmarked William Eaton, London 1811. Height 3.75" (9.5cm), gross weight 9.05 ozt (281.7 grams). £200-300 (plus 27.6% BP*)



A George III silver lidded jug, the shaped footed base rising to a fluted vase shape body below a waisted neck and domed, hinged lid with urn finial, having stipple punched borders throughout, initial engraving to one side and a wicker bound scroll handle. 



Modelled as the Earth surmounted with an engraved banner detailed Championship of the World, raised upon an octagonal base with engraved panels depicting scenes of boxers, and panels detailed: Lord Lonsdale Trophy presented by the British Boxing Board of Control (1929), and: Flyweight Championship of the World (15 rounds 3 minutes each round), Benny Lynch (Gt Britain) v Small Montana (Philippines) at The Empire Pool, Wembley, 19th January 1937, referee C B Thomas (Wales) won by Benny Lynch (on points). Each panel interspersed with smaller panels cast with leaf and berry decoration. The spreading circular foot impressed with maker's mark and hallmark, and engraved to underside Mappin & Webb Ltd.

The whole raised upon a stained mahogany stand with engraved 9ct gold panel detailed: Presented to Alfred L Ellsworth by many of his friends on the occasion of his presenting an ambulance to Hairmyres Hospital and the attainment of his target a most outstanding record of over £5000 collected within 18 months for various charities 16th January 1944.

Benjamin Lynch was born in Scotland in 1913, he learnt his boxing skills in carnival booths in the West of Scotland during the great depression before making his professional debut in 1931. by knockout.

This trophy established Benny Lynch as the 'undisputed' Champion of the World.



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- 4.2 The Vendor warrants and represents to Fellows and the Buyer that the Vendor is the sole and true owner of the Consigned Property or is properly authorised by the sole and true owner to consign it for sale and is able to transfer good and marketable title to the property free from any third party claims.
