A late Victorian silver mounted and cut glass claret jug, having a swollen, star cut base leading to hobnail cut cylindrical body, rising to a silver mount with face of Bacchus amidst foliage and foliate embossing, the frill rimmed hinge lid with conforming decoration and lion finial holding an initial engraved cartouche, above etched, curved handle and foliate motif spout. Hallmarked Charles Boyton (II), London 1894. Height including finial 10.75" (27.5cm). £300-500 (plus 30% BP')

A sterling silver overlay and glass four section decanter of rounded form stamped 'Sterling Silver', the oval, glass windows to each interior section surrounded by bamboo, blossom, cloud and dragon embossed piercing, and the cylindrical column stem of conforming design, rising to four wide brimmed spouts. A William IV silver chamberstick, the shaped, central plate with reeded border, leading to central taper stick of conforming design with removable nozzle, with armorial engraving to handle. An early Victorian silver salver, of circular form with foliage and scroll rim enclosing interlocking geometric engraving and central armorial, upon three splayed, scroll feet. An Edwardian silver cream jug, of circular tapering form with Celtic Knot panels depicting animals and birds, and a similarly modelled handle. A Victorian silver christening mug, of lobed, baluster form with ornate scrolled acanthus decoration enclosing initial engraved and vacant cartouches, upon waved, spread foot, having a scroll mounted handle. A matched pair of George III Scottish silver pedestal salts, of rounded, rectangular form, each having scrolled shell motif to corner of beaded rims, with scrolled engraving and armorial engraved panels to central body, raised on four balled feet. A Victorian silver fruit serving set, comprising a sifter spoon and four serving spoons, each with shell bowl to a part spiral stem and apostle finial, in fitted case. A pair of Edwardian silver dishes, each of circular form with scalloped edge and shell handles, the shallow bowl with embossed band of stylised floral motifs within bead borders. An Edwardian Irish silver sugar bowl and sauce pot, both of plain, rounded form, each having central, engraved armorial, shaped rims and four shell mounted hoof feet. A Victorian silver christening mug, of cylindrical, engine turned form, having a central, circular panel with belted border, and foliate mounted curved handle. A George II silver muffineer, of plain bellied form with girdle detail and raised on a spread circular foot, the pull off bun top lid with simple drilled holes. 
